Duties at a Glance

1. PLEASE REMEMBER: ONEG RESPONSIBILITIES ARE SHARED BY ALL MEMBERS OF THE FAMILY NAMES LISTED.
2. Arrive 15-20 minutes prior to start of services, set up and make tea. Tea pot is in bottom cabinet next to social hall kitchen door. Instructions and a map of the kitchen are posted above the same cabinet.
3. Fill large Kiddush cup and small plastic cups with wine/juice for community Kiddush.
4. Provide kosher/parve baked items for 30-40 people (50-75 for family services), cold beverage and lemon for tea. No animal fats; vegetable shortening only; dairy OK but must be labeled as such. (Also, please label items that contain nuts.)
5. Use glass dishes and cups stored in cabinet to left of pass-thru counter. Paper goods may also be used (stored in cabinet right of wall ovens).
6. Place leftover baked goods in refrigerator for Shabbat morning Kiddush. Baked goods must be covered.
7. Load dishwasher (but don't run), wash and put away tea urn and Kiddush cups; clean tables and countertops.
8. Evening services begin at 7:30 p.m., unless otherwise noted in the monthly bulletin.
