Barrio Manouche.....Sept. 17, 2017

A San Francisco-based international septet, Barrio Manouche plays music that will take you on a magical journey of "Flamenco Gypsy Jazz." Recognized for their innovative style, complex technique, and their passion for their musical improvisation, their repertoire is instantly recognizable as deeply influenced by a range of musical traditions.
