

SELLING OF CHAMETZ

During Pesach, we do not eat or own chametz, and one should remove all chametz before Pesach. To avoid great financial loss, it is permitted to sell one's chametz to someone who is not Jewish and repurchase it after Pesach. This is a contract for a legally binding sale. You may appoint me as your agent to sell your chametz on your behalf by filling out the form below. If possible, all chametz –any product made of wheat, barley, oats, rye or spelt and any mixture or derivative thereof- or materials containing such unacceptable food –should be destroyed or given away before the holiday begins. Should this be impossible, the chametz may be stored in such a way that we are sure not to use it during the holiday and its actual ownership is transferred to a non-Jew until the holiday ends. Please sign the form below. The undersigned fully empower and authorize Rabbi Bromberg to sell all chametz possessed by the undersigned knowingly or unknowingly – as defined by Torah and rabbinic law, and to lease all places wherein chametz owned may be found. This transaction will be in effect for the duration of Pesach, which this year begins with sundown of Wednesday, April 1, 2026 and runs through Friday, April 10, 2026.
